

MASTER CHIEF HOSPITAL CORPSMAN CLINTON A. GARRETT SR.
(Surface Warfare/Fleet Marine Force)

Master Chief Clint Garrett is a native of Detroit, Michigan. His first exposure to the Navy was a Naval Junior Reserve Officer Training Academy at Murray Wright Senior High School. Upon graduation he entered the Navy on October 6, 1984 and attended both Recruit Training Command & Hospital Corps School in Great Lakes, Illinois. He has attended the following advanced schools, Field Medical Service School, Camp Pendleton, California; Preventive Medicine Technician (PMT) "C" School (graduated with Honors), Oakland, California; and Medical Department Administrative Technician "C" School, San Diego, California.

Master Chief Garrett is dual warfare qualified in Enlisted Surface Warfare Specialist and Fleet Marine Force Warfare Specialist. He is a graduate of the National Defense University Keystone Course, Senior Enlisted Academy (Class 96, Khaki) and holds a Masters in Health Care Management, Bachelor in Health Care Administration and an Associate in Environmental Health. He served as a Character Development Seminar Leader, and Senior Capstone Facilitator for the United States Naval Academy's Ethics Department.

His sea tours include, 1st Force Service Support Group; Hospital Company, 1st Medical Battalion; 1st Supply Battalion; Leading Petty Officer, 1st Landing Support Battalion, deployed to the Persian Gulf during Operation Desert Shield, and served as a member of the Medical Administrative Assessment Team, Group Surgeon's Staff, augmenting the Inspector General's Team; and 3rd Force Service Support Group, served at 3rd Medical Battalion. He deployed aboard USS Belleau Wood (LHA 3) in support of Operation Beveled Incline during civil unrest in Indonesia, and to the Persian Gulf with MEU Service Support Group 31, aboard the USS Germanton (LSD 42) in support of Operations Desert Fox and Southern Watch.

He has served in the following assignments, Naval Regional Medical Center, Bremerton, Washington; Naval Hospital Camp Pendleton; Naval Medical Clinic, Annapolis, Maryland; Naval School of Health Sciences, Bethesda as Director for the Health Resources Management Course; and the Naval Medical Education and Training Command, as the Officer learning Continuum Senior Enlisted Advisor, Chaired the Enlisted Learning Continuum Workgroups, and as Director for the Executive Medical Department Enlisted Course; Navy Senior Enlisted Leader at Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps, in Washington, DC. He currently serves as the Brigade Senior Enlisted Leader, Uniformed Service University of Health Sciences in Bethesda, Maryland.

His personal decorations and military awards include: the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal (3rd), Navy Achievement Medal (5th), Navy Unit Commendation, Navy Meritorious Unit Commendation, Good Conduct Medal (5th Award), Fleet Marine Force Ribbon, National Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Southwest Asia Campaign (USMC), Sea Service Deployment Ribbon, and Kuwait Liberation Medal. He was nominated twice for the Dr. Martin L. King Jr. Civic Award, and the NAACP Roy Wilkins Renowned Service Award.
