Major Heather Johnson is an assistant professor in the USU Family Nurse Practitioner Program. She is responsible for planning, implementing and evaluating course content and clinical rotations for second year nursing students.

She previously served as the element leader and a family nurse practitioner at Robins Air Force Base in Georgia. Highlights from other assignments include performing as a family nurse practitioner at Ramstein Air Base in Germany and Keesler Air Force Base in Miss. Major Johnson was also an assistant nurse manager and a clinical preceptor at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in Ohio and a clinical nurse at Dyess Air Force Base in Texas.
