Lieutenant Colonel Kevin Bohan, PhD, CRNA **Research Director of the USU Nurse Anesthesia Program**

Air Force Lt. Col. Kevin Bohan is the research director of the USU Nurse Anesthesia Program. He is responsible for managing and overseeing the research pursuits of students in this program. Additionally, Dr. Bohan holds concurrent positions as the deputy director of the Nurse Anesthesia Program and the director of Anesthesia Simulation Education.

Dr. Bohan commissioned into the Armed Forces after receiving a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the University of Wisconsin - Madison. He went on to receive a Master of Science in Nursing from the Uniformed Services University and a Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Wisconsin - Madison.

Dr. Bohan began his career in the USAF Nurse Corps at Warren Air Force Base in Cheyenne, Wyo. For three years he worked as a staff nurse inside the Newborn Nursery and Surgical Ward. After his tour was complete, Dr. Bohan was promoted to nurse manager and reassigned to the United States Air Force Academy Hospital in Colorado Springs, Colo.

Since then, Dr. Bohan has completed several assignments at top military treatment facilities across the United States. Prior to arriving at the University, Dr. Bohan served as the staff nurse anesthetist at the Elmendorf Air Force Base Hospital in Anchorage, Alaska.

Dr. Bohan is an accomplished author and presenter. Findings from his research in anesthesia outcomes have been shared with academicians across the country. Additionally, Dr. Bohan is involved in several scientific and professional organizations. He is the chair of the USU Graduate School of Nursing Curriculum Committee; served as the liaison of a congressionally directed medical research program; and is a member of the Doctorate of Nursing Practice Task Force, the American Association of Nurse Anesthetists, and the Society for Simulation in Healthcare.

Dr. Bohan has been honored with many awards throughout his career including: the Meritorious Service Medal with the Oak Leaf Cluster, a National Defense Service Medal with a Bronze Star, a Meritorious Service Medal, and an Air Force Commendation Medal with a second Oak Leaf Cluster.
