

ICM-III SESSIONS AT A GLANCE

SIMULATION CENTER COMPREHENSIVE H&P SESSIONS (4)

Prior to the session, the student should:

1. Review the previous SimCenter encounter videotape and complete the self-critique for (2) of the first (3) sessions
2. Complete a written H&P from the previous session (4 required, one for each of the first 4 comprehensive H&P sessions)
3. Review the syllabus sections "Guidelines" and "Clinical Skills"

Equipment Needed:

- Bring **ALL** your medical equipment for all these sessions
- White coat is mandatory
- Uniform of the day is Class B or equivalent

Session Content (2:30 hrs) *Note: Preceptors may individualize sessions at their discretion*

5 min: Intro to session

1 hr, 15 min: Perform Comprehensive H&P with standardized patient

1 hr, 10 min: Preceptor Time

- Student Oral Case presentation
- Bedside teaching

After the session

1. **Hand in** any outstanding items to the preceptor
 - Self-critiques from the previous SimCenter session
2. **Email** written H&P to preceptor prior to next SimCenter session

HOSPITAL SESSION (1)

Prior to the session, the student should:

1. Double check the schedule and **verify location** (MGMC, Soldier's Home, NNMC, WRAMC) and reporting time
2. **Carpool to WRAMC** due to difficult parking issues
3. Utilize course material (syllabus, Mosby textbook, Evidence Based Physical Dx) to review areas of the H&P you may need to improve
4. Review the "Clinical Skills" section in the course syllabus

Session Content (3:30 hrs) *Note: Preceptors may individualize sessions at their discretion*

15 min: Report to Site, receive patient assignment, report to patient room

1 hr, 30 min: Perform comprehensive H&P with hospitalized patient

15 min: Prepare Oral Case Presentation

1 hr, 30 min: Preceptor Time

- Case presentation (this will be emphasized for this session)
- Bedside teaching

Equipment Needed:

- Bring **ALL** your medical equipment for all these sessions
- White coat is mandatory
- Uniform of the day is Class B or equivalent

No write-up or critique is required for hospital assignments. You are encouraged to read about your patient's medical problems or management issues.

FOCUSED H&P SESSION AT USU MDLs (1)

Prior to the session, the student should:

1. Utilize course material (syllabus, Mosby textbook, Evidence Based Physical Dx) to review areas of the H&P you may need to improve
2. Review the "Clinical Skills" section in the course syllabus

Session Content (2.5 hrs) *Note: Preceptors may individualize sessions at their discretion*

- 5 min: Report to assigned standardized patient room
30 min: Student A will perform focused H&P on standardized patient
-Student B will watch and evaluate Student A
40 min: Preceptor Time
-Bedside teaching
-Feedback from student, standardized patient, and preceptor
5 min: Orientation to second standardized patient encounter
30 min: Student B will perform focused H&P on standardized patient
-Student A will watch and evaluate Student B
40 min: Preceptor Time
-Bedside teaching
-Feedback from student, standardized patient, and preceptor

Equipment Needed:

- Bring **ALL** your medical equipment for all these sessions
- White coat is mandatory
- Uniform of the day is Class B or equivalent

After the session:

1. Students will exchange Mini-CEX feedback forms

SPECIALTY PHYSICAL EXAM SESSIONS (17) (USUHS and/or clinical sites)

Prior to the session, the student should

1. Read assigned syllabus readings/Evidence Based Physical Dx
2. Check your **INDIVIDUAL** schedule to verify the time and location of each session
3. Sessions at WRAMC will require bus transportation (see below)

SESSION CONTENT

- **Abdominal Exam Sessions:**

These sessions are designed to give you hands on experience in specific abdominal examination techniques and should introduce you to pathologic conditions and their associated physical exam findings.

Equipment needed: Stethoscope, white coat

NNMC: See individual schedule

WRAMC: (*NO PARKING, see bus info below). See individual schedule

- **Bone & Joint Sessions:**

These sessions are designed to give you more knowledge in both small joint pathology (rheumatologic disorders) and large joint pathology (PM&R) in addition to advanced exam techniques associated with the musculoskeletal system.

Both sessions occur at WRAMC

Equipment needed: White coat

Small Joints: (*NO PARKING, see bus info below) See individual schedule

Large Joints: (*NO PARKING, see bus info below) See individual schedule

- **Dermatology Sessions:**

These sessions are designed to give you exposure to common presentations of dermatologic pathology. There is an introduction lecture at USU followed by clinic show and tell at either NNMC or WRAMC.

Equipment needed: White coat

INTRO SESSION: 1300-1400 hrs - Will be held in Lecture Rm D, USUHS

HOSPITAL SITE: See individual schedule for your location.

NNMC: See individual schedule

WRAMC: (*NO PARKING, bus pick up at 1400 by USU flagpole) See individual schedule

- **Geriatric Seminar:**

These sessions are designed to raise your awareness of specific geriatric issues (dementia, falls, etc...), and include both interactive audience participation and live standardized patients.

Equipment needed: None

Held at USU: See individual schedule

- **GYN Pelvic Exam Sessions:**

These sessions are designed to give you the basic knowledge and skills for performing a routine female GU exam in addition to a vaginal delivery. You will have an introductory lecture followed by hands on experience using a plastic pelvis model. The sessions at the Sim Center are split between performance of complete female GU exam on a teaching associate, and performing a vaginal delivery on a simulator.

Equipment needed: White coat required for teaching associate session at Simcenter

INTRO SESSION : Held at USU, Lecture Room D. See individual schedule for details

TEACHING ASSOCIATE SESSION: Held at the Sim Center. See individual schedules

- **Medical Communications:**

This session is split into two parts. The first part of this session is dedicated to an advanced lecture in oral presentations. The second part of this session is designed to give you more guidance on the importance of accurate written and oral presentations, and the relation to medical errors.

Equipment needed: None

Held at USU: See individual schedule

- **Neurology Sessions:**

These sessions are designed to give you more information and hands on experience with specific neurological disorders. Session 1 is designed as an introduction lecture with some explanation of exam techniques. Session 2 is designed to provide hands on experience with history and physical exam techniques on standardized patients. Session 3 is hands on experience with patients in the clinic and hospital.

Equipment needed: Bring **ALL** your medical equipment, white coat

Session 1 and 2: held at USUHS (see individual schedule for exact location)

Session 3: held at **WRAMC** (*NO PARKING, see bus info below) See individual schedule

- **Pediatric Exam:**

These sessions are designed to give you hands on experience with accomplishing a physical exam on a toddler in addition to taking a HEADSS interview with an adolescent. There are no physical exams done on the adolescents.

Equipment needed: **No white coats**, bring **ALL** medical equipment to day care session

DAYCARE SESSION: Held at NNMC Daycare center. **No scary white coats.** Bring your diagnostic equipment.

ADOLESCENT SESSIONS: Held at Kennedy High School. No equipment

- **Psychiatry Sessions:**

These sessions are designed to give you first hand experience in interviewing patients with psychiatric disorders. You will not be doing physical exams on these patients. Held at several locations (*hospital assignments will be posted prior to sessions)

Equipment needed: None

- **Vascular Exam & Surgical Techniques Seminars:**

These sessions are designed to give you an anatomy refresher in addition to presenting you with the basics of surgical knot tying.

Equipment needed: None

Will be held in Lecture Room D/MDL, USUHS (See individual schedules)

***BUS INFO:** Bus transportation has been scheduled for **ALL specialty sessions** held at WRAMC. **THERE IS NO PARKING FOR THESE SESSIONS.** Bus will pick you up on assigned day at 1230 hours, by USUHS flagpole to take you to WRAMC. The only exception to this 1230 pick-up time is with the Dermatology session (see above). Return bus leaves WRAMC at 1610 hrs to return you to USUHS for all sessions without exception.

Please remember to carpool for the Hospital sessions at WRAMC. Since you are not going over in large numbers for these sessions, bus transportation is not provided as it is for the specialty sessions.
