

*Student Introduction to
Ambulatory Rotation in Internal Medicine*

1. Welcome to Kimbrough Ambulatory Care Center at Ft. Meade. We hope you will have fun here and learn what it's like to see medicine patients in the outpatient setting.
2. Duty uniform is Class B or BDUs.
3. Your workday runs 0830-1600. You will see at least 2 patients in each half-day session. You may choose to book patients for brief follow-up visits (we encourage continuity!). The clerk at the front desk will give you a schedule for the day. Some appointments may be filled with same-day appointments or consults.
4. You will be given an office with a CHCS terminal and examination equipment. Please ask if you can't find something.
5. The clinic has some textbooks you may use for reference. The medical library at Kimbrough has many current journals, and Internet access.
6. You have 1 hour to work up a new patient. Budget your time so there is enough opportunity to review the case with your preceptor and then finalize an action plan.
7. If the patient has a regular physician in the clinic, ask for the convenience file, or check our file room for one.
8. Your preceptor for each session is the "ASAP" doctor. The front desk can tell you who that is. We would appreciate your comments at the end of the rotation about the preceptors. You may speak to Dr. Lisa Moores if you have specific comments about your preceptor.
9. We will submit interim and final evaluations about your performance to Dr. Moores. You should ask your preceptor for feedback at the end of the day.
10. We would be happy to accommodate any special interests you may have.
11. Preceptors will be happy to review any write-ups you do on patients seen in this clinic.
12. Our clinic has a kitchen with fridge and microwave. Snack food and soda machines exist. You may want to bring your own lunch, or go to the PX complex. There is a deli and a Burger King.
